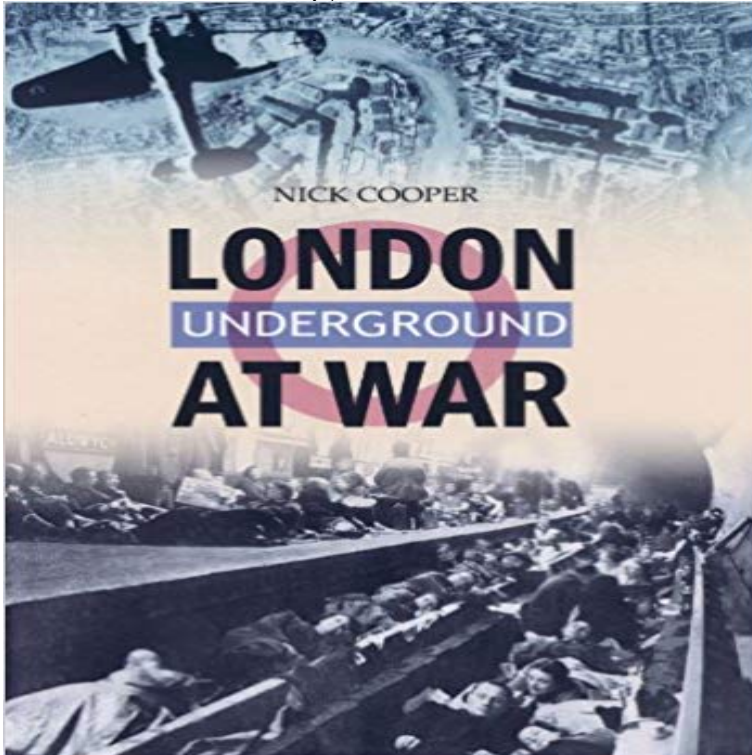


Londons Underground at War



The coming of war brought many challenges to the day-to-day running of the city, not least to the infrastructure of the transport system. Some of these problems, such as the possibility of a breach in the tunnels under the Thames or the vulnerable Victoria Embankment flooding the network, had been anticipated by the authorities and special protective measures were in place. Other aspects of the war, especially the effects of the Blitz are covered including the community-driven adoption of the deep Tube lines as refuge from the air raids. As a result London transport was tasked with constructing a number of purpose-built deep shelters. Most of these structures still exist, although largely unnoticed among today's busy city landscape. Nick Cooper also looks at the social changes such as the role of women workers in keeping the trains running, and what life was like for those seeking safety underground. Sections include: The Coming of War, The Blitz and Beyond, Major Incidents, Protection in Depth, Shelter Life, The Thames Problem, Plus Appendix: Survey of remaining structures/shelters, memorials and Casualty List.
